

DID YOU KNOW?

Some estimates hold that the 2001 Maha Kumbha Mela

in Prayag drew over thirty million pilgrims on January 24 alone. Guinness World Records claims that with 20 million people on January 30, 1995, the Ardha Kumbha Mela at Prayag holds the record for the "Largest Religious Crowd." Aside from other recent Kumbha Melas, such as Prayag's 15 million on February 6, 1989, and Haridwar's 10 million on April 14, 1998, the next runner-up is the Hajj pilgrimage to Mecca with 2 million Muslim pilgrims. Christian evangelist Billy Graham drew his largest crowd in Seoul, Korea, in 1973 with 1.25 million, possibly the largest Christian gathering ever. Six million Christians pilgrimage to Lourdes, France, and 2.4 million people pilgrimage to Jerusalem, not daily, but annually. A hundred thousand people gathered in the Vatican for Easter in 1996, and 40,000 for Christmas in 2000.
